Denver Solar Co-op Basics

What is this initiative?

The Denver Solar Co-op is a joint initiative by the City and County of Denver and the nonprofit Solar United Neighbors to help grow solar adoption in our community.

A solar co-op is a member-led, streamlined group-buy process to help residents go solar and save money. The co-op is free to join, has no obligation to go solar, and can help save money on projects. 62 families and businesses in Denver have gone solar through our coops so far, having invested \$869,000 into the community with a projected energy cost savings of \$1.5 million over the next 25 years.

What is the Denver Solar Equity Rebate Pilot Program?

Starting with our 2021 Denver Solar Co-op, income-qualifying members can receive a \$3,000 rebate for solar and a \$2,000 rebate for battery storage for their project while funding is available.

Members who meet low-to-moderate income eligibility requirements will qualify for a \$3,000 solar rebate and \$2,000 battery rebate towards the cost of their project. A hardship

fund will support unforeseen circumstances, such as necessary roof repairs. The Denver Office of Nonprofit Engagement (D-ONE) will assist residents interested in additional bill savings by connecting them to non-profits administering income-qualified energy efficiency programs.

1. Email Template

Have you heard of the Denver Solar Co-op? Solar United Neighbors is working with the City and County of Denver to bring interested home and business owners together into a group, called a solar co-op. Co-ops take advantage of the group's bulk-purchasing power to get discounted pricing and a quality installation. Co-op volunteers choose an installer on behalf of the entire group through an open and competitive bidding process. The selected installer provides everyone in the group with a personalized proposal for their consideration; there is no obligation to install. Income-gualifying residents can also receive a \$3,000 rebate off the cost of their solar project!

- **Panel Discussion:** Explore important topics related to solar and distributed energy, elevate important voices through sharing stories, and identify opportunities and challenges.
- **Set Up Solar Trivia:** Test your solar knowledge with a fun event that can be hosted at the local brewery or online.
